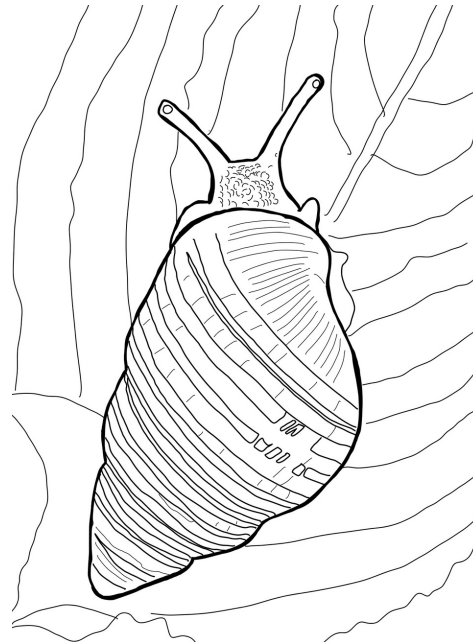


All 209 species in the family Achatinellidae are endemic to the Hawaiian Islands. This is perhaps the most well-known family because Achatinellinae, a sub-family within the Achatinellidae, contain all three genera of large tree-snails of which 44 species are listed on the U.S. Endangered Species List.

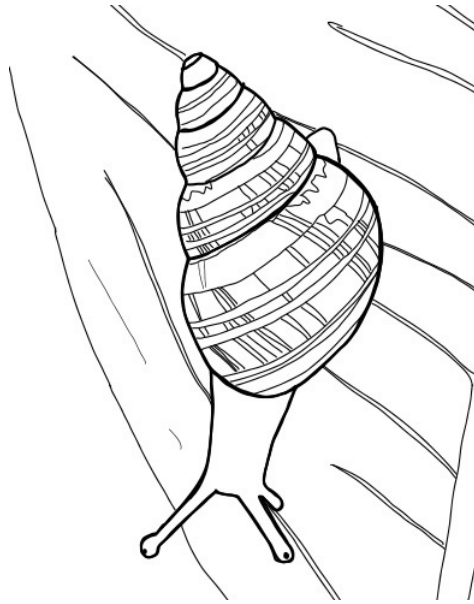

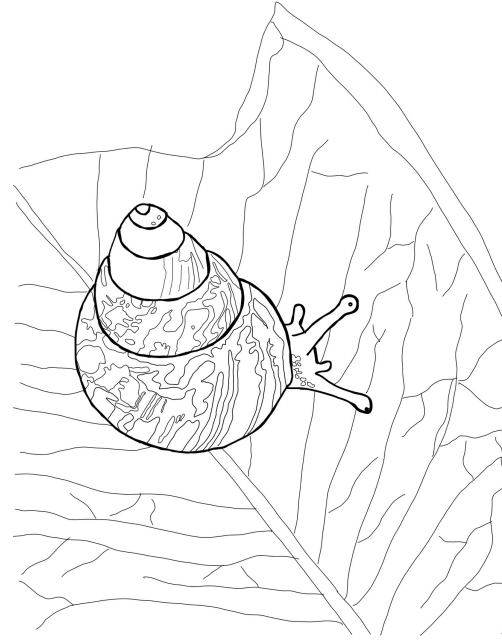
