

PROGRAM RECOGNITION GUIDELINES

Kaulunani’s Year of Our Community Forests Grants Program is funded by the state of Hawai’i DLNR Division of Forestry and Wildlife. As such, your cooperation will help provide visibility and good publicity for all.

ACKNOWLEDGING YOUR GRANT

We require that grantees acknowledge Kaulunani’s involvement. Grantees are encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this award and, from time to time, to announce progress and accomplishments. The recipient may decide how best to provide that acknowledgment. Examples are as follows:

- *Funded by a grant from the Kaulunani Urban and Community Forestry Program of the DLNR Division of Forestry and Wildlife.*
- *This project was made possible by the support of the Kaulunani Urban and Community Forestry Program of the DLNR Division of Forestry and Wildlife.*

For projects with other/multiple funding sources (use as applicable):

- *Funding provided, in part, by the Kaulunani Urban and Community Forestry Program of the DLNR Division of Forestry and Wildlife.*

LOGO USE

While not required, Kaulunani, DOFAW and DLNR would appreciate their logos being displayed on published materials (event flyers, webpage, social media posts, etc.). Kaulunani logo must be preceded by both the DLNR and DOFAW logos and cannot be used alone. Please note the following order of display:
