On behalf of Kamehameha Schools, G70 is providing this courtesy notification of the publication and availability of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Keauhou Bay Management Plan, located in Keauhou, Hawai'i Island, Hawai'i. The Final EIS was published in *The Environmental Notice* on September 8, 2025.

Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawai'i Revised Statutes and Hawai'i Administrative Rules, (Environmental Impact Statement Rules), Title 11 Chapter 200.1, an EIS is required as the project requires a County Special Management Area Use Permit and proposes certain uses within the shoreline area. The Final EIS document can be downloaded from the Environmental Review Program's website at these links (please be advised that an error message may be received if the link is used prior to September 8, 2025):
