PURPOSE of SET ASIDE & IMMEDIATE MANAGEMENT RIGHT-of-ENTRY PERMIT:

Cultural and ecological restoration, education and related ancillary purposes.

CHAPTER 343 - ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT:

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) § 11-200.1-16 and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources reviewed and concurred on by the Environmental Council on November 10, 2020, the subject request is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to:

General Exemption Type 1: Operations, repairs or maintenance of existing structures, facilities, equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion or change of use beyond that previously existing.

Part 1, Item 36: Transfer of management authority over state-owned land, such as setting aside of state lands to or from other government agencies through a Governor's executive order.

The proposed set aside to COM is an administrative action that allows COM to manage the subject properties. No development or ground disturbance activities are associated with the transfer of management authority. COM shall be responsible for compliance with Chapter 343, HRS, to the extent applicable to its proposed use of land. In this regard, staff notes various Governor's Proclamation Relating to Maui Wildfires suspended Chapters 343, 171, and 6E, HRS (among other statutes), to the extent necessary to respond to the wildfire emergency, may be cited as additional authority of this transition of management responsibilities.

Therefore, staff recommends that the Board find that the proposed transfer of management rights will have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and should be declared exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment and the requirements of § 11-200.1-17, HAR.

APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS:

Applicant shall provide survey map and descriptions according to State DAGS standards at applicants' sole cost.

REMARKS:

The 2023 Lahaina wildfires ignited a push toward the consolidation and revitalization of historically and culturally significant lands within the Lahaina Historic District.

Many of the historically and culturally significant lands are managed by the State of Hawaii, Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR). As part of the State's response to the August 8, 2023, Maui wildfires, Governor Green pledged to take action to restore historic and sacred spaces to the community to facilitate its healing and recovery. The action staff is recommending represents another step in the process of Lahaina's restoration.

By correspondence in September of 2023, the Office of the State Librarian, began to contemplate the relocation of the State library site, identified as EO 1614 and 1675, to better serve the west Maui community pursuant to the total loss of the pre-existing Lahaina library facility (Exhibit G & H).

By letter dated August 19, 2024, Department of Education Superintendent, Mr. Keith T. Hayashi, requested the cancellation of Executive Order no. 222 and the return of lands, that served the King Kamehameha III Elementary school site, to the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Exhibit I).

By letter dated April 8, 2025, Maui County Mayor, the Honorable Richard T. Bissen, requested that various parcels under the management and control of the DLNR be set aside via Executive Order (EO), to the County of Maui, for cultural and ecological restoration, education and related ancillary purposes (Exhibit J).

Approval of this request will allow the County to collaborate with community stakeholders to restore, honor and protect the numerous culturally and historically significant sites within the Lahaina Historic District, in a coordinated, consistent and holistic manner.

Additionally, staff is recommending that the Board authorize the issuance of a management right-of-entry permit to COM to allow immediate commencement of restoration work upon subject properties pending the preparation and execution of the new EO by the Governor of the State of Hawaii.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board:

1. Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed disposition as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200.1, HAR, this project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment as a de minimis activity.
2. Approve of and recommend to the Governor issuance of an Executive Order canceling Governor's Executive Order Nos. 222, 1614 & 1675, subject to:
 - A. The standard terms and conditions of the most current executive order form, as may be amended from time to time;
 - B. Disapproval by the Legislature by two-thirds vote of either the House of Representatives or the Senate or by a majority vote by both in any regular or special session next following the date of the setting aside;
 - C. Review and approval by the Department of the Attorney General; and
 - D. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.
3. Approve of and recommend to the Governor the Issuance of an Executive Order setting aside the subject parcels to the County of Maui under the terms and conditions cited above, which are by this reference incorporated herein and subject further to the following:
 - A. The standard terms and conditions of the most current executive order form, as may be amended from time to time;
 - B. Disapproval by the Legislature by two-thirds vote of either the House of

- Representatives or the Senate or by a majority vote by both in any regular or special session next following the date of the setting aside;
- C. Review and approval by the Department of the Attorney General; and
 - D. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.
4. Authorize the issuance of an Immediate Management Right-of-Entry Permit to the County of Maui covering the subject parcels for cultural and ecological restoration, education and related ancillary purposes which are by this reference incorporated herein and further subject to the following:
- A. The standard terms and conditions of the most current right-of-entry form, as may be amended from time to time;
 - B. The right-of-entry shall be for a term of one year or the execution of the Executive Order, whichever is sooner, commencing upon Chairperson approval, which may be extended by the Chairperson for additional one-year terms for good cause shown; and
 - C. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1611

**CANCELLATION OF GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER
NO. 1372, DATED APRIL 6, 1950, AND SETTING
ASIDE LAND FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, by Governor's Executive Order No. 1372, dated April 6, 1950, certain lands situate at Pa Pelekane, Lahaina, Maui, Territory of Hawaii, were set aside for library purposes, under the control and management of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Maui; and

WHEREAS, the said Board of Supervisors of the County of Maui, by Resolution No. 42, dated March 3, 1954, requested that said lands, hereinbelow more particularly described, be cancelled and be set aside for library purposes under the control and management of a suitable and proper department of the Territory of Hawaii;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SAMUEL WILDER KING, Governor of the Territory of Hawaii, by virtue of the authority in me vested by paragraph c of Section 73 of the Hawaiian Organic Act, and every other authority me hereunto enabling, do hereby order as follows:

- 1. Governor's Executive Order No. 1372, dated April 6, 1950, covering the lands described hereinbelow, is hereby cancelled; and**
- 2. That the lands hereinbelow described be set aside for a public purpose, to-wit, the construction of a library building and the maintenance of it for library purposes to be under the control and management of the Department of Public Works, Territory of Hawaii.**

Lot 5, containing an area of 14,020 square feet, as shown on Map 1, filed in the Office of the Assistant Registrar of the Land Court of the Territory of Hawaii with Land Court Application No. 190 to the Territory of Hawaii and being a portion of land described in Owner's Certificate of Title No. 1123 issued to the Territory of Hawaii.

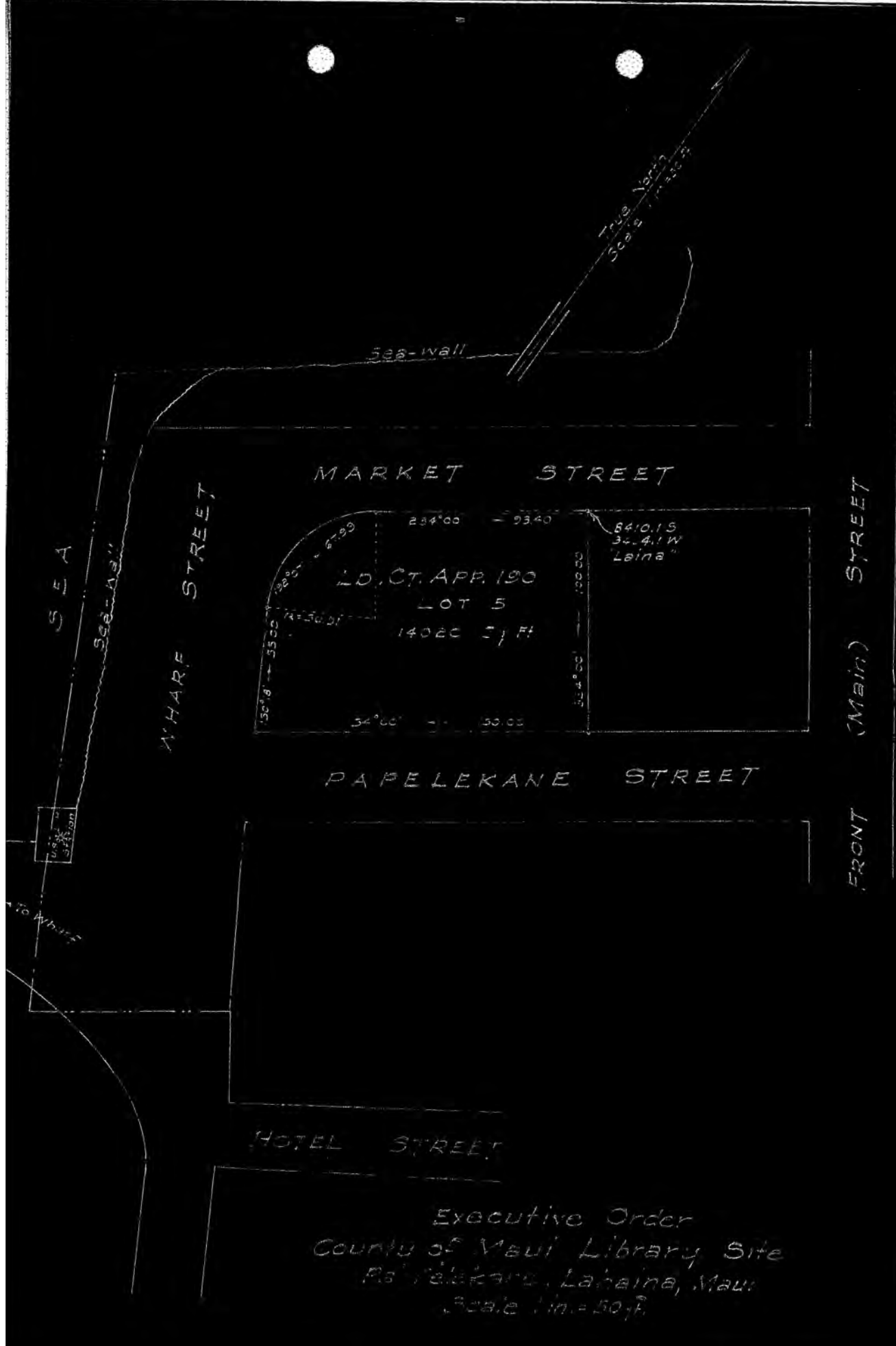

Setting Aside Land for Public Purposes

By this Executive Order, I, the undersigned, Governor of the Territory of Hawaii, by virtue of the authority in me vested by paragraph q of Section 73 of the Hawaiian Organic Act, and every other authority me hereunto enabling, do hereby order that the public land hereinafter described be, and the same is, hereby set aside for the following public purposes:

FOR an Addition to the Lahaina Branch Library Site, to be under the control and management of the Superintendent of Public Works, Territory of Hawaii.

That certain parcel of land known as Pa-pelekane Street, being portion of Lot 6, situate at Pa Pelekane, Lahaina, County and Island of Maui, Territory of Hawaii, more particularly described as follows:

Lot 6-C, containing an area of 5,011 sq.ft.,

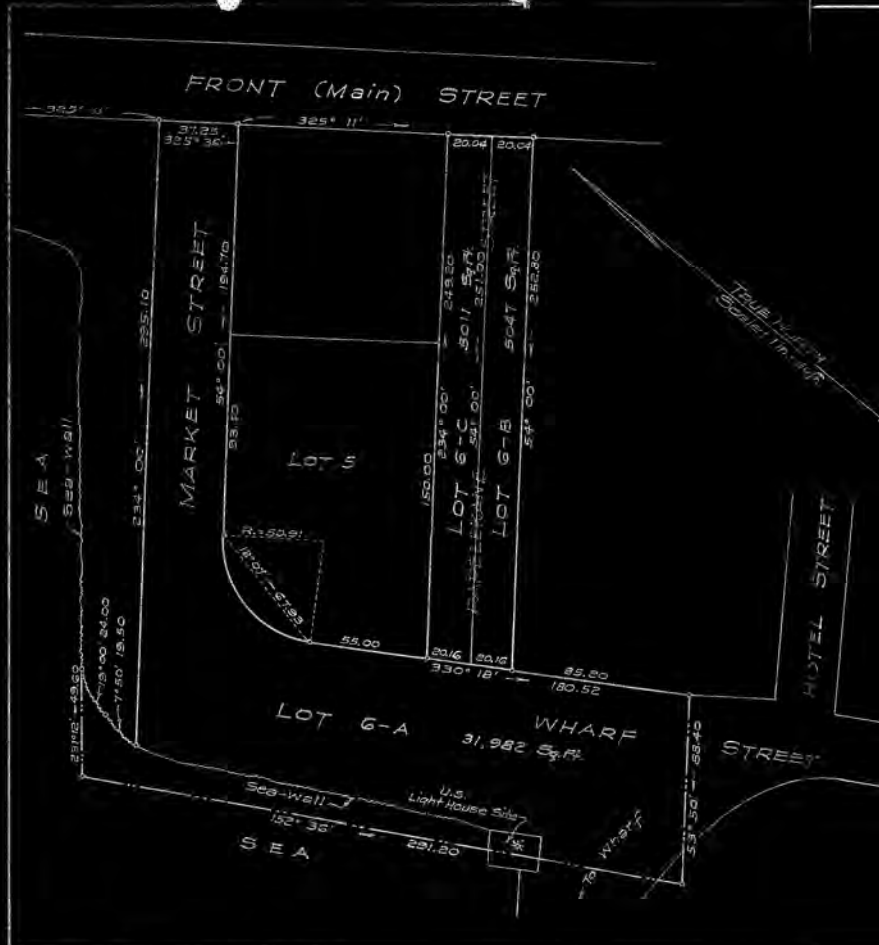

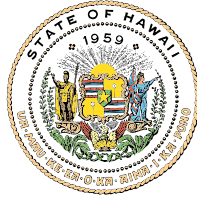

SUBJECT: Request for the Withdrawal of Executive Order No. 222
King Kamehameha III Elementary School from the Hawaii State
Department of Education

As an unfortunate result of the August 8, 2023, Maui wildfires that destroyed many structures in and around Lahaina, causing significant loss of life and property on the west side of Maui County, the Hawaii State Department of Education (Department), tragically lost our beloved and respected King Kamehameha III Elementary School. Other than one (1) building (Building C) that remains standing and will not be demolished, this historic campus is a total loss.

As you are aware, the United States Army Corps of Engineers in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency is currently removing debris from the school site. During this cleanup, there is also an effort to retrieve and preserve specific artifacts from the King Kamehameha III Elementary School site to perpetuate the legacy of this treasured campus.

Until the Maui wildfires, the Department operated a portion of the King Kamehameha III Elementary School campus (approximately 4.7 acres) under the authority of Executive Order 222 (EO222), a copy of which is attached to this memorandum for your reference. Out of respect for the cultural and historic significance of the school site, and the extensive requirements and costs that would also shrink the 4.7 acre site for any possible rebuild, the Department respectfully requests the withdrawal of EO222 so that it may be returned to the care and custody of the State of Hawaii, Department of Land and Natural Resources.

This request is made pursuant to Section 171-11, Hawaii Revised Statute, Public purposes, lands set aside by the governor; management. More specifically:



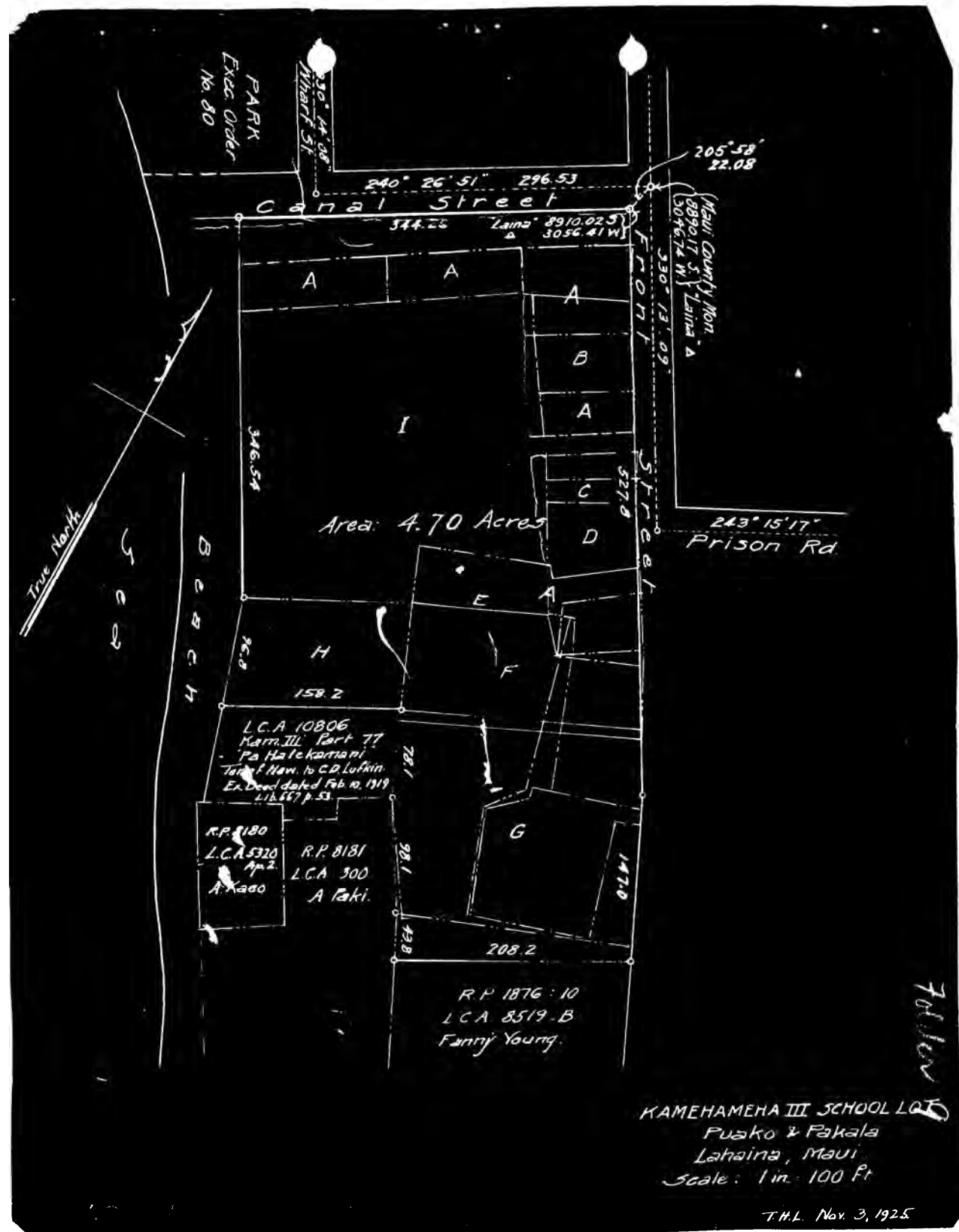

SUBJECT: REQUEST TO SET ASIDE LANDS VIA EXECUTIVE ORDER IDENTIFIED AS TMK NOS. (2) 4-6-001:007; (2) 4-6-002:014; (2) 4-6-007:008 & 044; FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI VIA EXECUTIVE ORDER

The 2023 Lahaina wildfires stimulated a renewed push for the revitalization of Moku'ula, Loko o Mokuhinia and other historically and culturally significant lands for the healing and recovery of the Lahaina community and lāhui. These lands carry tremendous significance in Hawaiian history as the royal palace of King Kamahameha III from 1837 to 1845, connections with many of Maui's and Hawaii's greatest rulers, and religious significance as a sacred site.

Many of these historically and culturally significant lands are owned by the State of Hawaii, some of which are under executive order to the County of Maui. With this letter, I respectfully request that the above referenced parcels be set aside via executive order by the DLNR for the County of Maui. The purpose of the set aside will be for cultural and ecological restoration and education. Approval of this request will allow the County to collaborate with community stakeholders to restore, honor and protect the numerous culturally significant sites in a coordinated and holistic manner. 
